Objectives:

- Strengthen the role of paediatric Pharmacy Technicians by providing guidance, training, and professional development to enhance their contribution to children's healthcare.
- 2. Build a strong network to support collaboration, peer learning, and the exchange of practical experiences among Pharmacy Technicians working in paediatrics.
- 3. Develop and sign post accessible resources that address the specific needs of Pharmacy Technicians, including standardised processes, competency frameworks, and training materials.
- 4. Advocate for recognition and progression by ensuring the role of paediatric Pharmacy Technicians is represented in national discussions, policies, and workforce planning.
- 5. Promote best practices in medicines management by supporting initiatives that improve safety, efficiency, and patient outcomes in paediatric pharmacy services.
- 6. Encourage mentorship and career development with other Pharmacy Technicians.





- 7. Facilitate innovation and research by supporting Pharmacy Technician-led projects that enhance paediatric pharmacy services and contribute to evidence-based improvements.
- 8. Establish a knowledge-sharing platform to provide Pharmacy Technicians with ongoing access to updates, case studies, and problem-solving discussions tailored to paediatric care.
- 9. To represent and champion Pharmacy Technicians within the NPPG.
- 10. Support with peer discussions as part of annual GPhC revalidation.

Activities:

- **Meetings**: Steering committee meeting monthly 2nd Thursday of the month 1-2pm.
- Study days: ½ day study day 3 times per year.

Planned Activities:

- Working alongside the DGH subgroup to develop a paediatric drug history protocol for use across all settings.
